This month we are not going to go on about Cars Parked Poorly, Hedges not cut, Dog Poo not picked up, or the fact that the Parish Council is in desperate need of 5 more Councillors, we want to focus on the positive things that we are working on to improve things in the Parish of Credenhill that we all love.

'Thank You' to the First World War generation who served, sacrificed, rebuilt and changed the nation



In November we will be supporting the remembrance parade that will lead up Station Road from the green at Trenchard Road to the War Memorial to remember 100 years since the end of WW1.

We are pleased to confirm that the request to buy an RAF Silent Silhouette was approved and that it will be installed on the village green near the tree in recognition of our RAF heritage. Please support the parade and if you know of any veterans that would like to join us then please get in touch with the church committee.

We also agreed to get the War Memorial formally listed so that it is preserved for future generations.

Community Defibrillator Appeal

The Parish Council is funded through the precept which forms part of your council tax bill; we will next receive money in April 2019. The Parish Council could increase the precept to include a budget for a defibrillator which would see every household pay £4 extra so that we could buy a defibrillator – the earliest we could have this installed due to funding would be May 2019.

But if we raise the money together then we don't have to wait until then!

It was decided that we would raise the money through grants and crowd funding; so a project that we are calling Restart Credenhill has been born.

There are several parts to Restart Credenhill:

- ✗ We need to raise £2500 to pay for the AED & Cabinet
- ✓ We need to provide an electricity supply to the cabinet
- ✓ We need to service the AED Annually
- ✓ We need to provide training to the community



Progress So Far

- ✓ We have requested grant money through "The Rotary Club" and "Carriers for Causes"
- ✓ Onestop have agreed to install the cabinet at the front of the shop and supply it with electric.
- ✓ We will be placing collection tubs in OneStop, Credenhill Chip Shop, Jasmine House and the Doctors.
- ✓ We are working with Heartstart Herefordshire to deliver free training to staff in the shops, the school and the community.

Dear Friends,

The season of harvest is almost completed and the churches in the Magnis Group are now holding their Harvest Festivals. If you want to know when and where they all are, check out the services on the notice board at the shops and at the bottom of the church lane. (Details of the Credenhill services are here in the CCN.) Farmers and growers harvest their crops for much longer these days with potatoes, maize, root crops and apples still to come. It has been a tough year for livestock farmers, particularly because they needed to feed their animals well into early summer due to the wet and cold spring and the slow growing grass; then they have been feeding next winter's feed through August, leaving a possible shortage for this coming winter. So it is a worrying time for them. As we celebrate the harvest we will be mindful and prayerful of this and the ongoing harvesting.

As summer has now ended and the long stretch of winter is ahead of us, I have been hearing more and more about people who are feeling very low, depressed even, at this time. I guess that after a lovely summer we all feel a bit 'down' now. But for some, this time of year can be difficult - especially if they are living alone. There has been a lot in the media this year about mental health - something we all have, and most of us will experience poor mental health some-time or other. Please don't hesitate to contact me if you want someone to talk to confidentially. I would love to spend time with you if you would like to talk; it's what I'm here for.

Credenhill Park Wood to close for tree thinning works to regenerate ancient woodland

Credenhill Park Wood near Hereford is due to close for a short period from mid-September for tree thinning work as part of an ongoing programme of ancient woodland restoration.

The work at the Woodland Trust owned site will look to restore the ancient semi natural woodland to some of its former glory by thinning conifers planted in the 1960s that are shading out many important woodland plants.

Credenhill Park Wood is a well-loved and iconic feature in the landscape sitting atop a steep hill and surrounded by Herefordshire farmland. The wood is crowned with a nationally important Iron Age Hill Fort enclosure.

The Woodland Trust said the work at Credenhill Park Wood is part of a UK-wide programme to restore woods that date back from at least 1600 but have more recently been planted with non-native species. Conifers such as the Norway spruce and Douglas fir seen at Credenhill Park Wood block out the sunlight and damage the rich and ancient ecosystem below.

Georgie Barnard, Woodland Trust contracts manager said: “By careful woodland management, letting light back in through the canopy, important ancient woodland species can thrive again. We hope local people will be sympathetic to the closures and recognise the long-term benefits to these woods.” The closure will be from the week beginning 17 September 2018 and will be for approximately three months.

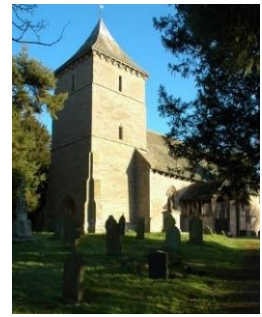
The work, which is being overseen by the Woodland Trust, will focus on selective thinning of the conifer plantations. Rather than clear felling, this approach of selective thinning, felling, coppicing and ride management, encourages natural regeneration. The aim is to restore the site to a predominantly mixed native broadleaved canopy with a rich understory of native trees, shrubs and other plants.

While conifer trees will remain part of the overall long-term make-up of the wood, they will not shade out the remnants of ancient woodland plants and trees.

The Woodland Trust has already cleared part of the hill fort, revealing an impressive open space at the top of the woods. Further work has also taken place over the past year to improve the tracks through the wood, which have previously been muddy and waterlogged. Visitors to the woods after they re-open, will see the most notable differences caused by the thinning in the southern part of the hill fort.

During the works, the entire wood and car park will be closed to the public as thinning is taking place across a wide area of the woods and the car park will be required for timber stacking and machinery storage. The closure is essential for the safety of both the contractors and public. It is estimated that it will take three months dependent on weather and ground conditions, please see our website for updates.

Thank you to Jean Wells for hosting our poppy-making morning. We made poppies out of felt, painted pebbles with poppies and made poppy bunting. It is not too late for you to be involved. Many people are busy creating poppies to commemorate the centenary of the end of WW1. We hope to fill the village with poppies. We will put displays in church, at the tree, at the war memorial and on the green at the entrance to Trenchard Avenue. We would be happy if as many as possible could decorate your homes/windows/doors/fences etc with poppies. We would like as many organisations to be involved as possible. So far, the school, Credenhill Court, the Brownies and Rainbows have offered to make poppies. Some will be knitted, some painted pebbles, some felt, some recycled pop bottles and some made from wood. Please help us to make this a success. We are currently organising the Remembrance Parade which will start from Trenchard at 10:30 am to the war memorial (outside the school). We hope that the uniformed organisations, the school, veterans and families will join in the parade. Following the service in the school we hope villagers will join us for a Peace Lunch. The Parish Council have kindly agreed to support this. More details to follow.

As far as I know we have had no response to my appeal last month asking you to tell us what you would like to see in Credenhill, so until we hear differently we will carry on trying to facilitate opportunities for people to get together as best we can.

Our next community event is the Harvest Supper Service. This will take place at Headway on Thursday, October 11th. We will serve a hot harvest supper at 7pm (doors open from 6:30) followed by a short harvest celebration. The meal will be provided by the ladies of the church and there is no charge for this. However, we will have a collection plate for donations. To help with catering we would be pleased if you could let us know if you intend to join us but if you change your mind last minute please still come along.

Messy Church will re-start on Saturday 13th October at Headway from 3pm -5pm, when the theme will have a harvest connection. The afternoon will begin with craft activities followed by a story and songs and ending with a shared tea. Everyone is welcome. (Children should be accompanied.) This is a free afternoon of fun and friendship. For more details please check our Facebook page or contact Donna Jones. (donnajones4249@googlemail.com)

This year's traditional All Age Harvest will be held on Sunday 14th October at 11am. The theme will be sharing our talents. 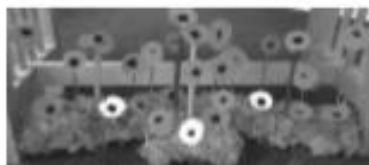
