YOUR PARISH - HAVE YOUR SAY! How should we spend your money?

As we remember those who sacrificed themselves so that we could shape our future it's important also to remember that the Parish Council is led by members of the public who voluntarily give up their time to help shape our immediate and near future. The decisions that your parish council makes collectively should reflect the needs and wants of those who live in the community that the parish council represents. They can only do this if they know what you want.

This month we will be planning ahead for the 2019-2020 financial year and preparing a budget based on what the Parish wants to do for the future as well as what it needs to do to remain compliant and to continue to fulfil its responsibilities.

We often hear County Councils and Government say these are challenging times and because of this more burden is placed on the Parish Council. Next year the grant scheme for footpaths and lengthsmen are being discontinued. So we have a choice; do we increase the amount the community pays towards the upkeep of the village or do we let footpaths deteriorate like in other Parishes? Next year is also an election year for ward and parish councillors; the County Council recharge the cost of elections to each of the parishes. It is estimated that these 2 items alone will cost the parish an additional £3000 next year and £1000 each year thereafter. We also need to maintain and update our facilities such as the Community Hall, Social Club, Resource Centre and Roman Park.

We will provide a full budget update in December's edition.

Shaping the future of Credenhill

What is a Parish Council Responsible for and what Powers does it have?

Parish councils have the power to tax their residents to support their operations and to carry out local projects. Although there is no limit to the amount that can be raised, the money can only be raised for a limited number of purposes, defined in the 1894 Act and subsequent legislation.

Duty to provide facilities

Parish councils have powers to provide some facilities themselves, or they can contribute towards their provision by others. There are large variations in the services provided by parishes, but they can include the following:

Credenhill Parish Council does these	Not done at present but can be if required
Support and encouragement of arts and crafts	Provision and maintenance of cemeteries and crematoria
Provision of village halls	Maintenance of closed churchyards
Provision and maintenance of recreation grounds, parks, children's play areas, playing fields and swimming baths	Cleaning and drainage of ponds, watercourses and ditches
Control of litter	Provision and maintenance of public toilets
Creation and maintenance of footpaths and bridleways	Provision of cycle and motorcycle parking
Maintenance of war memorials	Acquisition and maintenance of rights of way
We have just successful applied for a grant for cycle racks!	Provision and maintenance of public clocks
	Encouragement of tourism
	Duty to consider providing allotment gardens if demand unsatisfied.

Parish Councils may also provide the following, subject to the consent of the county council:

· Bus shelters · Signposting of footpaths · Lighting of footpaths · Off-street car parks · Provision · maintenance and protection of road-side verges

Representative powers

Parish councils must be notified by the district or county council of:

All planning applications in their areas

Intention to provide a burial ground in the parish

Proposals to carry out sewerage works

Footpath and bridleway (more generally, 'rights of way') surveys

Intention to make byelaws in relation to hackney carriages, music and dancing, promenades, sea shore and street naming

Miscellaneous powers

In some cases parish councils exercise the following powers:

Creation of a neighbourhood plan · Guardianship of common land · Withholding of consent to stop up unclassified highways and foot-paths

The Vicar's Letter

Dear Friends,

This year's Remembrance Sunday service will have a special significance as marking 100 years since the end of the First World War. This commemoration will mark the culmination of four years in which the traumatic events of 1914-18 have been re-lived in countless publications and TV documentaries. In this country we remember these events with pride as well as sorrow, and in thanksgiving for victory. Our grief at the loss of so many young lives is lessened by the thought that their heroic sacrifice won our freedom. I hope that this Remembrance Sunday will help us to honour those who gave their lives, and to ensure that such catastrophes are not repeated.

So our act of Remembrance this year will very much focus on the peace won for us by those who were prepared to die, or who lost their lives, for the peace we now enjoy. Many of our church members and villagers, along with various organisations in the village have been busy, for several months now, making poppies to be displayed around the village. I encourage all of you to display poppies along fences, in gardens and in the windows of your homes, to make Credenhill, with its strong military connections, into a Poppy Village for this special occasion. I hope that as many of you who are able, will join us on 11th November at 10.30am for the parade from the green at Trenchard Avenue to the school where we will hold our act of Remembrance and commitment to Peace.

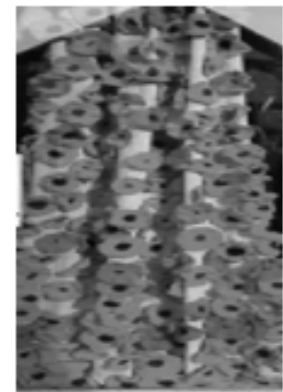

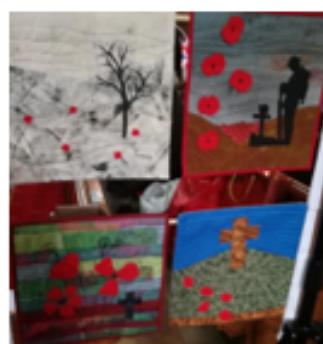
