It led me to wanting to discover if there were any relatives, or friends, or stories of any of these men, which could be shared and put in the C.C.N.

What stirred me to write this was when at the meditation on Good Friday in church the word "Sacrifice" was used, in relationship to the brutal death of the Crucified Jesus! Just as I realised that HE had done this for me. I wanted to thank those on the Memorial for their Sacrifice in giving their lives, for those who say "WE WILL REMEMBER THEM"

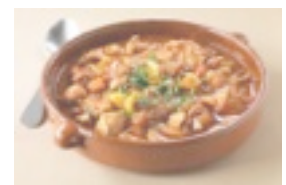

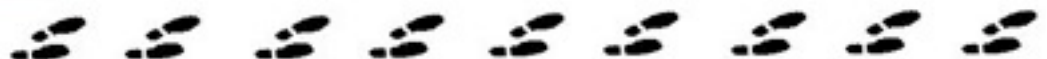

Parish Meetings

The next Parish meeting including the AGM is to be held on **WEDNESDAY 15 MAY 2013** at the Youth and Resource centre (preschool). The meeting will start at 7pm due to the AGM. All members of the public are encouraged to attend.

Flood alleviation scheme.

The community car park has finally been resurfaced. The parish council hope that the tarmac is of a higher standard than the previous work and that this is now complete. The parish council are now looking at the finishing touches such as parking bays.

Magna Castra Farm.

Hereford council are in the process of dealing with the outstanding landscape issues around the new building at the farm. The owner has also submitted a planning application for the slurry tank.

Neighbourhood planning.

The parish council are, like many other parishes looking at a neighbourhood plan for our village. The parishioners along with the parish council decide where and what type of development should happen in Credenhill. The plan can also protect local buildings, open spaces and the parish boundary. Without the plan being in place future developments will be determined by the guidelines set out in the core strategy. A document concerning Herefordshire's local plan 2011- 2031. The core strategy is currently being reviewed after a 6 week consultation.

The neighbourhood plan will need local people to be involved and work with members of the parish council. Should you be willing to join a steering group for the neighbourhood plan then please contact the parish clerk.

Parking

After several complaints regarding parking outside the school entrance on the brow of the hill and on the pavement between Glebe Close and Roman Park double yellow lines are being considered through Hereford Council.

Planning

The Parish council has received a planning application for 49 Glebe Close for the demolition of redundant structure and proposed single storey extension. The Parish council has made no comments on this application. Also received an application for 19 Tedder Avenue for the subdivision of the house into 2 dwellings. The parish council has also made no comments on this application. We are waiting for decisions on Sharaine and Mill Farm (Raw Striker).

Parish clean up

The parish council held a cleanup of the village and surrounding areas during April. Many thanks to those that participated in this worthwhile project.

Post Office

Unfortunately there are no further developments with the post office this month.

Roman Park

The parish council are considering making improvements to the entrance to Roman Park. Such as resurfacing and making a safe crossing for pedestrians using the community car park. More information to follow. Also under consideration is replacing more of the boundary fence around the park over the summer.

Safer Roads Partnership

The clerk has only received one request for a copy of the safer roads report. This is still available should you wish to obtain a copy then please contact the clerk.



HEREFORD MAY FAIR

Heart-stopping rides, side-shows, food stalls and ancient ceremonies are all part of the street extravaganza which is Hereford's May Fair. The fair has been taking place for over 900 years.

A ceremonial proclamation of the historic St Ethelberts Fair (May Fair) officially opens the fair, offering 12-and-a-half bushels of wheat by the Mayor to the Lord Bishop as payment for allowing the fair to proceed.

In 2013 Hereford May Fair will take place on Tuesday 7th to Thursday 9th May.

Leominster May Fair

Leominster May Fair is a smaller traditional fair held in selected town centre streets each April or May.

In 2013 Leominster May Fair will take place on Thursday 2nd to Saturday 4th May .

GARDENING



May can be a wonderful month in the garden and countryside: 'The merry month of May,' '...for like as herbs and trees bring forth fruit and flourish in May..' though I hesitate to continue that line from *Le Morte D'Arthur* for it goes on, 'in likewise every lusty heart that is in any manner a lover..' but that last bit isn't about gardening. It is a great time when lots of plants, shrubs and fruit trees are breaking into flower. Some of the May-flowering roses are beautiful, and heralds of the flush of summer to come – some of the ramblers are ahead of the rest, but I particularly like a short climber appropriately called 'Maigold'. Its arms can be stretched out horizontally along a fence or low wall, and it's superb. If you see it around and like it, order it for planting in the early winter. There are some superb May-flowering old-fashioned shrub roses too: *Rosa hugonis* and *Rosa cantabrigensis* for instance, growing 6 or 7 feet tall and about 6 feet across, but perhaps best of all is Canary Bird if you've got room for it, a bit wider by about another foot. Grow late-flowering clematis up through them to give another burst of colour later on, but plant the clematis a yard away from the rose and on its shady side.

Pinch out the tips of Michaelmas Daisies, heleniums, and other fairly vigorous-growing perennials so that they bush out. Sow biennials such as foxgloves, canterbury bells, sweet williams and wallflowers. Plant out dahlias and half-hardy plants as soon as the risk of frosts is over. Grass will be growing well, and also lawn weeds, so now is the time to apply a selective weedkiller. It's important to aerate your lawn, and although you can get expensive contraptions to do it, I think the best tool is a garden fork. Stick the fork in about 4 inches and ease it back to slightly lift the turf – I do it systematically across the lawn about 9 inches apart. This improves drainage, and ideally after doing it, rake sharp sand (but not builders' soft sand or sand with stones in) across the lawn so that it fills the holes.

In the veg plot, earth up potatoes, and at the end of the month plant out or sow dwarf beans, runner beans, broccoli, cabbages, lettuce, brussels sprouts, cauliflowers, savoys, etc. I reckon runner beans to be one of the most productive and cost-effective veg, and they needn't take up much space. You can grow them in a wigwam of sticks (they look quite in order in a flower border) and even 4 or 5 plants in a large tub will provide quite a reasonable supply as long as you remember to keep them well fed and watered.



Ah, the darling buds of May; but what Shakespeare wrote was 'Rough winds to shake the darling buds of May' – I hope not! But there's a burgeoning and a beauty around: enjoy!

Ingredients

- 1 1 quantity Barney's roasted rhubarb (see recipe, below method)
- 2 250g pack butter , softened, plus extra for greasing
- 3 150g pot ready-made custard (not the chilled kind; I used Ambrosia)
- 4 250g self-raising flour
- 5 ½ tsp baking powder
- 6 4 large eggs
- 7 1 tsp vanilla extract
- 8 250g golden caster sugar
- 9 icing sugar , for dusting

Barney's roasted rhubarb

Heat oven to 200C/fan 180C/gas 6. Rinse 400g rhubarb and shake off excess water. Trim the ends, then cut into little-finger-size pieces. Put in a shallow dish or a baking tray, tip over 50g caster sugar, toss together, then shuffle rhubarb so it's in a single layer. Cover with foil, then roast for 15 mins. Remove foil. Give everything a little shake, roast for 5 mins more or until tender and the juices are syrupy.

RHUBARB AND CUSTARD CAKE



Method

1. Make the roasted rhubarb first, carefully draining off the juices before you let it cool. Butter and line a 23cm loose-bottomed or springform cake tin. Heat oven to 180C/fan 160C/gas 4.
2. Reserve 3 tbsp of the custard in a bowl. Beat the rest of the custard together with the butter, flour, baking powder, eggs, vanilla and sugar until creamy and smooth. Spoon one-third of the mix into the tin, add some of the rhubarb, then dot with one-third more cake mix and spread it out as well as you can. Top with some more rhubarb, then spoon over the remaining cake mix, leaving it in rough mounds and dips rather than being too neat about it. Scatter the rest of the rhubarb over the batter, then dot the remaining custard over. Bake for 40 mins until risen and golden, then cover with foil and bake for 15-20 mins more. It's ready when a skewer inserted into the middle comes out clean. Cool in the tin, then dredge with icing sugar when cool.
