A theft from motor vehicle occurred between Thu 02/05/2013 16:30 and Thu 02/05/2013 17:30. This happened in Breinton springs car park, a handbag and its contents were stolen by unknown offenders.

On Friday 10/05/13 a drugs warrant was executed in Credenhill by West Mercia officers. No persons were present at the property so Officers forced entry, a search was conducted and miscellaneous items linked to cannabis were located on the premise along with 10 mature cannabis plants. The owner of the property was arrested, interviewed and following an admission was released on bail.

A theft occurred between Sat 18/05/2013 06:30 and Mon 20/05/2013 06:30.

A company based in Stretton Sugwas were victim of offender(s) who have accessed the yard by coming over hedge and stealing parts from a double axle ivor Williams trailer.

A theft occurred between Tue 21/05/2013 22:00 and Wed 22/05/2013 05:30. The theft occurred in Stretton Sugwas, Offender(s) have managed to enter the front garden and approach a free standing bird house which is on top of a long brown pole with metal feet before simply removing and stealing same. Nothing else in garden has been removed, moved or tampered with.

Between Sun 19/05/2013 10:30 and Sun 19/05/2013 17:40 Offenders have entered the front garden of the victim's home, which is easily accessed from the pavement. They have approached a pedal cycle which was lying in the front garden unsecured and removed the cycle from the garden. This occurred in the Credenhill area.

We all need to take time to rest and recover from our daily routine of work. WE WILL REMEMBER THEM



Before I give the next 10 names from the War Memorial, I need to make it plain that not all those named died in the 1st World War. For this correction I thank Marian Batchelor and Maurice Joseph. There were 15 killed in action, whose names are on the central panel of the memorial (their names are also included on the side panels). These names were NOT IDENTIFIED as killed in action in the first 20 I gave in the May C.C.N.

COX Albert,	GRIFFITH John (Senior)	GRIFFITH John (Junior)
GRIFFITH Gilbert	HALL Reginald	HOLTON William

Maurice Joseph told me of his Father, Frederick Joseph, being called up for service in 1916, at the age of 33, into the Veterinary Corps. He was experienced with horses because of his work on farms.

The only time his Father spoke of the war to him was when he told him how his horse was blown up and its legs were shattered, amid the scream and thrashing of the horse, he had to shoot it, only he knew, the pain which that brought him.

The family also discovered, from Frederick's medical records, that on joining up he had all teeth removed (ouch!). They also found out that he had a friendship with Alphon Brems a name also on the Memorial, but who was he? And did he live in Credenhill? Maurice knew that his Dad kept in touch with him writing to him after the war with an address in Antwerp, where he was a Police Officer. (Does anyone have any details?)

Maurice also spoke about his Uncle John (Jack) Joseph who was awarded the Military Cross, for bravery in the time of battle, when he rescued an injured officer (though full details are not known). Two of his sons Edward and Fred fought in the Second World War and both survived.

Painting the Brecon Beacons

Maggie Banks and Richard Bavin are two friends who share a passion for landscape painting. For them, the only way to do this is to get out there, whatever the weather, and experience it directly. For several years they have explored the rolling countryside surrounding their homes in rural Herefordshire. From most vantage points one can see the blue line of Offa's Dyke stretching across the horizon at the eastern edge of the Brecon Beacons National Park. Maggie and Richard could not resist the lure of this wild and varied region of mountains, moorland and deeply scoured valleys with their tumbling streams.

GARDENING by Doug Wellin



July and high summer; high hopes for weather and if we get some old-fashioned sunshine it will be good for gardens and gardeners. If you've got repeat-flowering roses, keep them dead-headed to encourage them to produce a succession of flowers.

If you've got some once-flowering roses, it depends what they are and whether they produce ornamental hips; if they do then leave them alone except to cut out some of the oldest stems, especially of climbing roses, to encourage them to send new shoots up from the base. Apart from roses, in general a good time to prune most flowering shrubs is after flowering. So doing you not only promote next year's blossoms but you stop the shrubs getting too congested, which is one of the main reasons for disappointing blooms.

If you've got apple or pear trees, especially if they are trained or espaliers, take your secateurs to them too. Give them a summer prune to take back the multitudinous shoots they'll throw out at this time of the year to no more than about 5 or 6 buds. Not only will this conserve energy for the developing fruit, but it will encourage more fruiting spurs for next year.

Perennials that have flowered can also be given the chop; take them down to about half their height. Hedges too! I am always surprised at the extent to which garden hedges are allowed to get out of control and take up other people's space. In Kent it has been the case that if a hedge exceeded the garden boundary and grew over a path or road, even a road verge, the District Council would take strong action and give notice that if the hedge wasn't taken back to the boundary, they would arrange for it to be done and send the bill. If a hedge won't take hard cutting back, is it a good hedge to have? It's often not only easier to maintain but also socially astute to get the saw, loppers and hedge cutter and teach the hedge where it's allowed to go and where it isn't.

For veg patches, sow seed outdoors for savoys, carrots, turnips, and plant out plants of autumn and winter cabbages, cauliflowers and kale. If you are enjoying eating the fruits of your labours with peas, broad beans, lettuce, early carrots and early spuds, make the most of them; enjoy!



Credenhill has some good soil, brought down as alluvial deposits at the end of the last Ice Age – just so that you can make the most of it.
