Dear Friends,

A lawyer asked Jesus what he must do to inherit eternal life. Jesus told him he should love God with all his strength and with all his mind, and love his neighbour as himself. Then Jesus told him a story to illustrate who his neighbour is. We've probably all heard the story; it's the story of the Good Samaritan from Luke 10:25-37. The Samaritan was the one who stopped to bathe and dress the wounds of a bandit victim after he'd been robbed and beaten and left for dead on the side of a dusty road. Two other people (one a priest, the other a temple official - the equivalent of a vicar and a churchwarden, I suppose!) had avoided contact with the injured man and had not bothered to stop, but walked straight past him.

The reason for this story is that we should all be good Samaritans for it could be any one of us who find ourselves in serious trouble. As I write this we are having a heat-wave! It has been wonderful to feel the warm sunshine after such a dismal summer last year, and it's very welcome. But for many of our neighbours it is too hot and they are at risk of dehydration. May I suggest that we all keep an eye out for each other and check that our elderly neighbours are getting enough to drink (older ladies are especially bad at this and need a lot of encouragement), that they can manage to get their shopping, and that they are feeling ok. And keeping an eye out for each other is how a Good Samaritan would behave all the time, not just when they happen across a victim in the gutter! It is a good principle to live our lives by, watching out and caring for our neighbours all the time. Jesus told the lawyer to "Go and do likewise", let's encourage one another to do the same.

Local Policing Team - Hereford Rural North and East

Your local Policing Team consists of :-

An incident of Harassment of another occurred between 9am Wednesday 24th April and Friday 31st May at Credenhill. A long term relationship has recently ended and it is alleged that the male has continued to contact the female via text and mobile telephone. Damage has also been caused to the victim's vehicle during the same period.

An offence of Criminal Damage occurred between 2pm Sunday 26th and 8pm Tuesday 28th May in Credenhill. The victim left his vehicle parked outside his address and at 8pm he discovered that the rear passenger side tyre was deflated. The tyre was replaced and it was established that there was a small hole in the tyre wall suggesting a deliberate act by an offender.

An offence of Criminal Damage occurred between 6pm and 8pm on Thursday 30th May at Credenhill. The victim parked their vehicle on the road outside the partner's home address in Credenhill. On returning to his home address he noticed a scratch down the passenger side of the vehicle from the rear door handle until half way along the passenger door.

A Theft occurred between 8am and 6pm Sunday 9th June at Bishopstone. Between the relevant times the outer gate of a property in Bishopstone was damaged by persons unknown. The offenders have then entered the garden and removed a CCTV camera which was located on the side of the property.

An offence of Interference with a Motor Vehicle occurred between 8pm Saturday 15th and 11pm Sunday 16th June at Byford. The victim owns a Blue Landrover Discovery. On a journey from Hereford to Byford a noise was detected and upon examination of the vehicle it was established that all the wheel nuts were loose including the locking nuts and only held on by 1.5 turns. The victim is adamant that this was a deliberate act.

An offence of Criminal Damage occurred between 8am Tuesday 18th and 5pm Wednesday 19th June at Credenhill. Persons unknown have caused damage to playground equipment in the children's play park namely a yellow spinner and removed bolts from other pieces of equipment.

A Theft in a Dwelling occurred between midday Wednesday 19th and 1pm Saturday 29th June at Credenhill. Due to a family illness the victim has been taken to hospital and relatives has subsequently attended and remained at the property. During this time an 18/20" necklace and pendant have been removed.

An offence of Possession a class A Drug occurred at 1.20am Saturday 29th June at Credenhill. MOD Officers were on routine patrol near Park Woods car park when they came across a vehicle. The driver was slumped over the driver's wheel. Enquiries were commenced and the driver admitted to having used Heroin. He was subsequently arrested.

Woodsmoke, dappled sunshine, laughter, sounds of a working woodland (hammering and sawing), distant chatter and a cool breeze on a hot summer's day. Many thanks for those of you who made it out to this event on one of the hottest days so far this year and were rewarded with cool shade amongst the trees, a gentle breeze and lots of fun activities. Summer is normally a quiet time for us in the woods. Tree felling is on hold during the bird nesting season and tree planting only takes place when the trees are dormant in the winter. Fortunately we haven't spotted any Phytophthora ramorum or Ash Dieback here yet (fingers crossed that this remains the case!).

Summer is a great time for exploring the woods. Go for a walk and a picnic and if you are looking for fun things to do then there are 150 free summer activities at naturedetectives.org.uk – so if you are struggling for something to do over the summer head for this website for inspiration.

GARDENING by Doug Wellin

August and school holidays, and even if for you it's not a time for getting away you might think of making it a holiday month from gardening. But if you are at home, doing nothing just gets boring, and poking about in the garden is cheaper and less stressful than the Costa in August.



Your lawn, if you have one. It's still a fairly good time to apply a selective weedkiller or a 'feed and weed' product, but after August leave it until next year. The proprietary 'feed-&-weed' mixes are expensive; unnecessarily so because the constituent ingredients do not come at a high cost to the manufacturers. The mixes are easy to apply with a spreader, and if you don't have one you might be able to borrow one from a neighbour (best) or hire one from a garden centre. Me, I don't think I'm mean with money, but I begrudge it on these products. The old-fashioned lawn sand has a lot going for it; it's cheaper, feeds the grass, discourages moss, and knocks back some of the weeds, so I find it good value. I use a sprayer with a dilute lawn weedkiller to knock clover about and other persistent weeds, but you have to be careful not only to get the mix right but also the rate of application. Too little and it's not effective, too much and you burn and kill the grass, but just right and it does the trick.

If you've got rhubarb stop pulling stems, and in any case it will be dying back from the end of July. Now's the time to give the plants a boost by scattering a general fertilizer around them, and the relatively cheap and long-established 'growmore' (in its granular form) is as good as any. You can buy it in boxes of modest size, but if you are going to use it on your veg patch it might be worth buying a small sack, provided you have somewhere dry to store it.

If you've got summer-fruiting raspberries (ah, one of the great tastes of summer!) cut out all the old fruited canes down to the ground and tie in the new ones. It's also a good time for taking semi-hardwood cuttings of flowering shrubs, and they usually strike fairly easily. If your neighbour has an attractive shrub, why not ask if you can take a few cuttings and even if only one succeeds you've won. With most, you take cuttings of between 4 and 6 inches (with fuchsias 3 or 4 inches), severing them just below a leaf node, then strip the lower leaves leaving just a couple of leaves at the top. Stick them in a cuttings compost, or a general purpose compost with some added horticultural sharp sand. Some people swear that hormone rooting powder helps, but I'm not sure that it does.



When you don't feel particularly active, decide what's in the wrong place and needs moving in the Autumn. I once knew a top gardener who said that plants in her garden needed to be on wheels because she was always deciding they were in the wrong places. If that was so for a top gardener there's plenty of excuse for the rest of us.
