## "Meals on Wheels"

The Meals on Wheels group, serving Burghill and Credenhill, are short of volunteers for delivering lunchtime meals.

We collect the hot meals from the WRVS in Hereford on a daily basis (5 days/ week), delivering to households in Burghill, Stretton Sugwas and Credenhill - usually 8 to 10 lunch meals daily. This usually takes 1 1/2 hours.

We do pay car expenses.

Our plan is to ask a volunteer to do one delivery per month. Swops can be organised around date clashes.

We really need this community service to continue to help people who are housebound and unable to cater for themselves.

Dear Friends,

Last time I wrote I said I would talk a bit about the Holy Spirit this time. As Christians, we believe in God our heavenly Father and his Son, Jesus Christ, and the Holy Spirit: three persons in one God - Father, Son and Holy Spirit. There have been many highly intellectual and learned theologians who have tried to explain the Holy Trinity and struggled. So I doubt if I can explain it simply!

But the way I think of it is this: we have a heavenly Father, who created us and the world, and separately, but also a part of him, is his Son Jesus who died on the cross to take the punishment of death - taking our place for all the bad things every one of us does, things that hurt God, others and ourselves. But Jesus overcame death, so that we can as well, so we can have eternal life after life on this earth. And, also a part of both God and Jesus, is the Holy Spirit - a bit like our own souls - you know, the spirit inside us that makes us think and feel - The Holy Spirit is like the soul of God and he is within both Jesus and God, and God and Jesus are a part of the Holy Spirit. I find that if I don't think too hard about it, it makes perfect sense!

When we are baptised God's Holy Spirit dwells within us so that we can know God's thoughts and his inspiration, although, because we are human we mostly ignore, or suppress those thoughts. Becoming a Christian doesn't automatically mean that we become perfect and can do no wrong! Alas, as humans we still make mistakes! But because Jesus has taken the punishment on the cross for us, when we are sorry and turn back to God he forgives us. All is not lost! If these thoughts raise any issues you would like to discuss with me, do contact me and we can have a chat over a cup of coffee... you would be most welcome!

Harvest time is now here, but most of us just see more farm traffic on the roads making them muddy and slowing our journeys down! Irritating though it can be, it helps if we remember that they are working long, hard hours to ensure that Britain gets fed! Those chips we enjoy at the local Fish & Chip shop here in Credenhill have to be dug up and transported back to the farmyard for processing! So this is the time of year for Harvest Festivals, a chance to thank God for his abundant generosity as he sends sunshine and rain on our crops and makes them grow. Credenhill celebrates Harvest at 11.00am on Sunday 13<sup>th</sup> with our All Age Worship service and this year we have one of the Padres from the camp coming along to take part in the service. Then in the evening there is a second chance to celebrate at the Community Centre at 6.00pm.

As I write it hasn't happened yet, but I know some of you have been involved for months getting things in place for the big event. ### ATTENTION ALL DOG AND CAT OWNERS

Once again I would like to remind all Dog Walkers/owners that they should clear up after their dog and dispose of bag and contents when they get home. Local householders are finding dog mess on their front gardens and on paths outside their homes - this seems to be a late night/early morning occupation and rather than walking, people are just letting their dog out loose for a few minutes before being called back in. There is a distinct difference between dog and cat faeces.

Also some owners/walkers after clearing up are now leaving the bags dangling from branches or in hedges. if you don't like visibly carrying the bag home, then buy a waist belt and pop it in ready to dispose at home.

Now to Cats. It seems that there have been quite a few cat deaths recently. Perhaps some could be explained by the following DO NOT treat your cat with products targeting dog fleas. Dog flea treatments use the insecticide permethrin, which is highly toxic to cats. Cat owners may be mixing up products or being unaware that they cannot use the dog treatment on a cat.

## **IMPORTANT TRANSPORT FOR SCHOOL CHILDREN**

Herefordshire Council has a responsibility for school transport and has been providing this service for many years. **NOW** in order to save money this policy is being reviewed, the current proposal is that entitlement to FREE transport be to their nearest school, rather than catchment school.

This concerns all parents in Credenhill who have or may have children attending Weobley High School, as this service will no longer be free, but will cost **£660 per year per pupil**.

Credenhill's nearest school is Whitecross with any overflow possibly going to Aylestone.

This will come into effect from September 2014 and will not have a phased approach as this is likely to cost more and cause complications.

## GARDENING by Doug Wellin

What will October bring by way of gardening weather? Some Octobers have a spell of settled balmy days and autumn sunshine when it's great to be in the garden; other years bring autumn gales and lashing rain. But given a decent average it's a month full of interest and potential enjoyment.



Hardy herbaceous perennial plants are great value and provide a huge amount of colour and interest. They often form the backbone of a mixed border, and although they die down for the winter they come up shining year after year. Not only that, but you can increase them for nothing to fill out gaps in the border, and this month is as good a time as any for doing that. Most benefit from division every few years, and replanting with vigorous divisions from around the edges, discarding the old parts in the centre. A few don't need such treatment and are best left alone – pulsatillas don't like disturbance, lupins and paeonies ditto – but most move happily and can be split up easily. Take up the whole clump, then many are amenable to being pulled apart with your hands but if more leverage is needed, two garden forks back-to-back will usually do the trick, but in extremis a sharp garden spade driven down with brute force won't produce any resentment.

There are literally hundreds of plants in this very useful and economical category, and I could list at least fifty that are attractive, well-known, obtainable and fairly trouble-free. A few examples, apart from the three already mentioned, might give a few clues and a bit of inspiration: veronicas (there is also an excellent prostrate variety that produces intense blue flowers), sidalceas, some of the sedums with deep colours (plant in groups of 3 or 4), perennial salvias, penstemons, phlox, erigerons, heucheras and heucharellas, astrantias, and if you've got a damp place monardas; but I'd better not go on.

This is a good time for planting new as well as dividing. Many garden centres sell plants when they're in flower, because that's when they sell well, rather than at the best time for planting, but if you're looking at a plant and you're not familiar with it, make a note of its name and check it out. For instance, don't buy physalis (chinese lantern) which doesn't light up and fly away but is a flaming nuisance, or some of the centaureas (cornflowers), and be careful about some of the prunellas because they pup everywhere. They don't tell you the bad habits on the labels but they oughta!



If you've got mint in the garden, you can prolong its season (minted potatoes and minted lamb, aah) by digging up a few roots, potting them up and putting the pot on a sunny windowsill. From now on when you mow the lawn raise your mower blades to avoid weakening the grass and encouraging moss and weeds. Most mowers are adjustable for the height of cut. And here's hoping for a 'golden October'.

## Woodland News at Credenhill Park Wood

The long summer days are behind us and the nights are drawing in. Autumn is just around the corner and brings with it my favourite time of year for a woodland. The autumnal colours are amazing to see and this is a great time for misty walks in a morning. At Credenhill there is a magical feel to the woods as you imagine times gone by and perhaps you will hear the sound of the fallow deer rutting in the distance too. I never tire of walking in woodland in autumn. I love being out on a sunny day too wrapped up against the cooler wind and with the sound of leaves crunching under my feet.

There are lots of activities you can do with leaves; from making leaf crowns, collecting items ready for making Xmas decorations later on, experimenting to see which leaves or seed floats to the ground the best or just creating collages on the ground using leaves and twigs. Go to [www.naturedetectives.org.uk](http://www.naturedetectives.org.uk) for more ideas of autumnal activities.

Autumn is a great time for fungi too. We will have been searching for these at our Bioblitz event so if you joined us we hope you had a great time and found loads of fungi and different wildlife too. We will let you know the highlights of our finds in December's edition.

There have been sounds of children enjoying and exploring the wood during August and Sept. In August we had a series of Forest Fun days –where families joined us making natural musical instrument and mobiles, telling stories, building dens, playing games and toasting marshmallows over an open fire. In September we ran a series of session for schools to come and have fun learning more about the wood's history and wildlife. The woods are generally now busier from a management point of view too. The birds have finished nesting which means we can look to continue or restorative felling. This continues to focus on removing some of the non-native conifer to reduce the threats they pose to remnant ancient woodland features. It is a slow process but already there are signs that features like ancient woodland flora are increasing in abundance (such as wood anemone, violet, primrose, garlic and bluebell). This year there has been much more greenery under the trees at the top of the hill fort too as more sun light is now able to reach the ground for the first time in decades.
