Dear Friends,

As I type this letter the election is taking place and the polling station is very busy. It is an exciting and yet unsettling time with an unknown future ahead of us. In fact our future is mostly an unknown entity. We might feel settled and that all is well in the world, but none of us can be certain what the next moment can bring. Only a couple of weeks ago Nepal was all quiet and well, and then an earthquake struck. And not just an earthquake but a huge and terrifying shift under the earth, which caused devastation, huge loss of life, and destruction of whole villages. We are so privileged to live and work in a place such as Herefordshire and Credenhill is a lovely place to be. Through all our uncertainty of what might be around the next corner, as Christians, we can be sure that no matter what is ahead, God is with us every step. He never promised us that we would have easy lives with no pain or sorrow, but he did promise to be with us through the difficult times as well as the good times; we just need to remember that he is there and trust in him. Of course when things are really difficult it is hard for us to begin to imagine that God is with us and it is when this happens that we should rely on other Christians to be there for us and to support us through prayer, as well as practically where we can. If anyone is feeling that life is particularly difficult I am always available to talk to and to help if I can in any way: please do ask, my number is on the back of the CCN.

We have put this in the hands of the Insurance Company but unfortunately we do not know when this happened and cannot prove that it is storm damage. We have had one quote to date of £2,700 including VAT, provided that there is no further damage to be found once the builders can inspect it closer. There will also be an architect's fee on top of that. We are launching an appeal to help towards the cost. As you can see it has Credenhill married quarters on the front [Oak, Elm and Trenchard ?] Looking at the sign the final stop was foxley [The old WW2 American hospital camp at Mansel lacy which later became a housing estate up until 1958.

GARDENING - JUNE *to do*
