School Transport Policy change

I have again discussed the issue of school transport with Cabinet Members and appropriate Officers, and stressed most strongly the special circumstances of local parents. Regretfully however, they state that they are merely carrying through government policies and insist therefore that their decision is final. Good morning Councillor

For clarification:

Herefordshire council consulted back in September/October 2013 about proposed changes to their home to school transport policy. Following the consultation Cabinet decided, in March 2014, to change the mainstream free transport entitlement policy from nearest or catchment school to nearest school only, effective from September 2015.

Therefore any current year 6 pupils transferring to high school in September 2015 will only be entitled to free transport if they live more than 3 miles from their nearest school (regardless of whether it's a VA, VC or Community school or an Academy).

Please note that the transport entitlement policy is entirely different from the co-ordinated admission arrangements which allows parents to state up to 3 preferences for any school. So on one hand parents have a degree of "choice" but on the other are only entitled to free transport if they live beyond the statutory walking distance to their nearest school. The legislation behind these two policies is set by central government not Herefordshire council.

The only exceptions to the above are parents of children who are entitled to free school meals who are entitled to free transport to any one of 3 schools within a range of 2 to 6 miles from their home or are attending on pure denomination grounds (i.e. a church place) a denominational school within 16 miles of their home address. These exceptions are covered under legislation called "Extended Rights".

GARDENING - JULY *to do*

1. Feed bedding plants once a week with high-potash tomato feed, and dead-head regularly to keep the flowers coming
2. Cut out spent flowerhead and tatty leaves on geraniums, delphiniums and lupins, give them good feed, and you'll get a second flush.
3. Clear blanket weed from ponds and water features, topping them up if necessary. A spray nozzle on the hose will introduce more oxygen into the water.
4. Head off disease and aid ripening in tomatoes by giving them light and air, stripping out the leaves from under the first truss, removing yellowing leaves and pinching out the side shoots on single stemmed varieties.
5. Have a thorough weed. If you haven't time, at least snap off the flowers, so nuisance plants don't get the chance to spread their seed.

Plant of the month - Rose

David Austin has a feeling this new rose - Rosa "Olivia Rose Austin" - introduced at Chelsea in 2014 and named after his granddaughter, is the best he has bred to date - a soft, pure pink that has a rich, fruity fragrance and is robustly resistant to disease. Only 90cm high it makes a charming, neat border rose.

Take some time off and visit RHS Hampton Court 30 June-5 July, 1 July Lean about herbs at National Trust East Riddlesden Hall, West Yorkshire or visit RHS Tatton Park nr Knutsford, Cheshire 22-26 July

- AUGUST *to do*

1. Check roses for black spot, picking off and burning affected leaves. Feed bedding plants once a week with high-potash tomato feed, and dead-head regularly to keep the flowers coming
2. Cut back areas of long grass and wild flowers, choosing a dry day and letting the grass lie for a day or two, so the seeds have time to drop.
3. If tubs or baskets are looking a bit weary, give them a good feed and give straggly plants a trim to encourage more sprightly new growth.
4. Prolong dryness may cause powdery mildew - like a sprinkling of dirty talc on acanthus, phlox, honeysuckle and roses. You can spray with a fungicide, while the best organic control is to keep plants moist and well mulched, and snip out affected shoots.
5. Trim English lavender towards the end of the month. (You can dry the last few flowers). Cut back to a neat 9" ball.

Plant of the month - Tree Houseleek

This is when succulents come into their own - showy but brilliantly low-maintenance plants that are ideal for containers and front gardens. None is more handsome than this new aeonium "Du Rozzen" from Trewidden Cornwall, which, unlike many, keeps its rich dark colour through the Winter.

In an attempt to answer the question posed by the picture taken at Hereford bus station, I can only suggest a few clues.

The RAF camp opened in June 1940 so the photo was later than this date. Yeoman of Canon Pyon (whose bus this is) used to run single deck buses until the increase in wartime traffic persuaded them to start using higher capacity double deck buses. Often they bought second-hand, (as in 1940 when they bought some well used examples from Glasgow Corporation) but occasionally a brand new bus entered the fleet. The photo shows a typical "utility" style body which was fairly common during wartime, with Leyland very often producing their own bodywork for their PD2 buses up until 1954, and other manufacturers having bodies made by the likes of Park Royal or Weymann etc. This particular bus, although the radiator is not too clear, looks to me as if it might be a Daimler CWA6, which would have had a 7.7litre AEC engine, and a was produced at the end of the period in question.



The upper bay window arrangement suggests Park Royal bodywork, and the lack of any headlight mask or white edging to the wings definitely puts this picture post-war. Just a point of interest to add, this type of body could only have been used to the north, east and west of Hereford, since the low bridges to the southern routes meant that only double deck buses with "lowbridge" bodies would work these routes.

To bring the date of the photo more up to date, the single deck bus just nosing into frame is a Bedford SBG with Duple Vega bodywork, and these were produced in the mid to late 1950's. The destination board affixed to the "healthy" asbestos bus shelter has the Yeomans logo at the top but not the matching green livery lower half that was in use up until at least 1961, so I'm going to stick my neck out and suggest this photo was taken in the early to mid 1960's. If I'm totally wrong, my name is Bro. Ken Halfshaft, Axlehousing Estate, Springhanger Lane.

If I'm within half a century of the correct date, I'm Rob Milan from Marden
