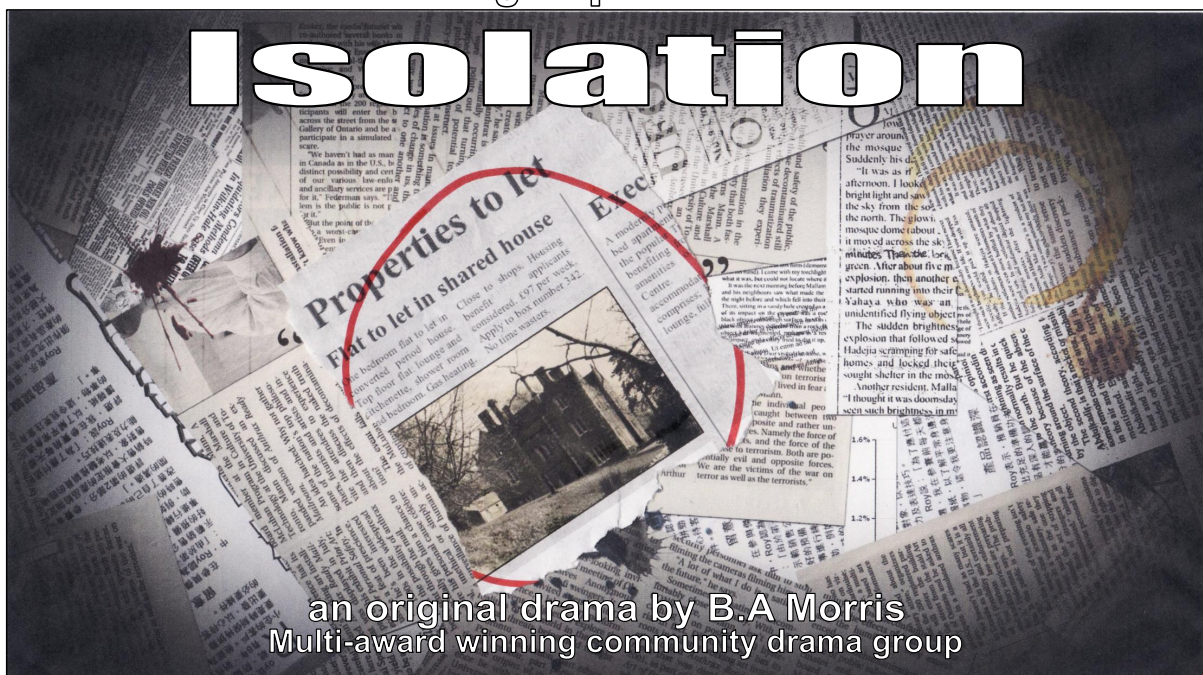

'Deal with each other justly, do not oppress the refugee, the fatherless or the widow, and do not shed innocent blood. Journey in all the ways I command you, that all may go well with you.' (Jeremiah 7, 6-7)

Dear Friends,

In the last month refugees and migrants fleeing their homelands has dominated the news with shocking pictures on TV, in newspapers and on social media. Try as we might, even the most hardened of us have been moved and perhaps distressed by what has been going on across Europe as thousands of families, who have been fleeing violence, torture, and rape, are running away with their children and facing the additional hardship of keeping not only themselves but their children safe, while trying to find a new home. Most of these people are fleeing violence and persecution in their home countries and the United Nations have rightly said these people have a legal right to seek asylum without any form of discrimination. Europe is changing and it's happening very quickly, as hundreds of thousands are crossing borders seeking a better life. Of course with them they bring their traditions and cultures that may seem out of place in many European countries. It can be incredibly difficult to accept people into our communities who differ so much from us. But we are a nation that has always been ready to give refuge to those who flee from danger, and quite rightly so as it would be inhuman not to.

Here in quiet Herefordshire we might feel pretty helpless even if we wanted to help in some way. Jesus said in one of his parables, *'just as you did to one of the least of these... you did it to me'* (Matthew 25:40). This makes our welcoming of every stranger a ministry to Christ himself. In looking into the face of the stranger we see someone with the dignity and worth of a saviour. This morning I saw on Facebook that an elderly war veteran had signed up to take a refugee into his home here in England. Whether he has faith in God or not, this is a man who cares for the stranger as Jesus intended we should. We might not all be able to open our homes, but as we weep now for those who are suffering, and remember the call of Jesus to 'welcome the stranger' we can also pray for, and work for, the dawning of a better world, a world where love has no borders or boundaries.

Lord God, no one is a stranger to you and no one is ever far from your loving care. In your kindness, watch over refugees and victims of war, those separated from their loved ones, young people who are lost, and those who have left home or who have run away from home. Bring them back safely to the place where they long to be and help us always to show your kindness to strangers and to all in need. Amen.

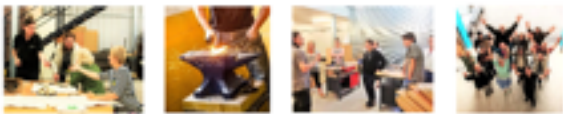
With MAKE Studios and Forge now working in tandem with services including business and technical advice, MAKE are building a more diverse and thriving maker community.

The importance of a Lasting Power of Attorney

Most of us realise that we should make a Will, but only a minority also consider setting up a Lasting Power of Attorney (“LPA”).

An LPA is a legal document which allows you to appoint someone that you trust to make decisions on your behalf. This can relate to any of the below:

- Your Property and Financial affairs
- Your Health and welfare
- Unavailability for some reason
- Incapability of making the decisions yourself

An LPA becomes increasingly important as you get older, but it is a common misconception that an LPA is only for the elderly. Younger people may also become incapacitated through illness or accident.

If you should lose capacity and have not set up an LPA for your property and financial affairs, it can result in lengthy delays whilst a family member or friend seeks to obtain a Court Order enabling them to deal with matters on your behalf. This is a costly matter and involves an ongoing duty to report and account to the Court on an annual basis. If, however, an LPA has been put in place and registered with the Office of the Public Guardian, your chosen attorney will be able to act straightaway, thereby avoiding unnecessary stress and anxiety for your loved ones.

It is often thought that an LPA for Health and Welfare is not essential because a person’s next of kin will be able to act on their behalf. This is incorrect. Your next of kin does not have any legal authority unless you have appointed them to act as your attorney under an LPA. Without an LPA, the local authority can appoint an advocate to act on behalf of a person who lacks capacity. Although family are entitled to be involved in any decisions regarding treatment and residence, they will not have the same level of authority that they would have if they were appointed as an attorney.

Pumpkin-Patch Brownies

2 ounces unsweetened chocolate, chopped
1/2 cup canned pure pumpkin puree
2 eggs
1 cup granulated sugar
1/2 cup light brown sugar
2 teaspoons vanilla extract
1/4 teaspoon salt
1/2 cup unsweetened cocoa powder
1/2 cup flour

Preparation

Preheat oven to 325°F. Line an 8-inch square metal baking pan with foil; grease.

Microwave chocolate and 2 Tbsp. water on medium for 2 minutes in a microwavable bowl; stir until smooth. Stir in pumpkin puree.

With an electric mixer, beat eggs, sugars, vanilla and salt on high until thick, about 2 minutes. Add pumpkin mixture on low. Stir in cocoa and then flour until blended.

Scrape batter into prepared pan. Bake until a tester comes out clean, about 30 minutes. Let cool on a rack for 1 hour.
