**CREDENHILL PARISH COUNCIL SURVEY**  
**DRAINS/SEWERS – PROPERTIES IN CREDENHILL**

In conjunction with the Public Health Directorate of Herefordshire Council, Credenhill Parish Council has agreed to undertake a survey of properties in the village to try and identify problems with drains/sewers. You may well be aware that central government is in the process of defining legislation to ensure that, eventually, water companies adopt all main sewers. It would appear that other than the Persimmon housing complex (negotiations between Persimmon homes and Welsh water are currently on-going) none of the main sewers in Credenhill have been adopted by a water company. Furthermore, we understand that records regarding drains/sewers in Credenhill are very limited and contain little information. The intention of this survey is a first attempt to collate information which we anticipate will help take this project forward. We should mention that no timescales have been published for this project to be completed.

If you have had any problems with the drains/sewer serving your property in recent years, we would be grateful for your co-operation by providing us with the following information

## **CREDENHILL PARISH COUNCIL NEWSLETTER**

Following are a few points I would like to bring to your attention:

### **Parish Meetings**

Parish meetings for the remainder of the year are scheduled for 15 Sep, 20 Oct, 17 Nov and 15 Dec. All meetings are held in the Youth Resource Centre and commence at 7.30pm. Members of the public are invited to attend. Come along and see what we do.

### **Parish Clerk**

The present parish clerk has notified that he wishes to resign from his position at the end of the current financial year (31 Mar 11). We are now looking to find a suitable replacement so that we can provide some training and a thorough handover. Brief descriptions of the main duties of the clerk are as follows:

- Produce agendas and minutes for Parish Meetings.
- Deal with all correspondence (including emails) addressed to the Parish Council
- Maintain Parish records (including planning register and updating some elements of the Parish website)
- Maintain the Parish Accounts

On average, the work of the clerk involves about 10 hours each week, the starting rate of pay is £8.41 an hour, and the clerk is also provided with a laptop and printer. If you are interested in applying for this post please contact me for further information.

### **Hereford Flood Alleviation Scheme**

You will be aware that as part of the Hereford Flood alleviation scheme, a flood diversion scheme will be constructed at the community site. We have been involved in negotiations with Hereford Futures (formally ESG) over the last 18 months and in return for meeting their requirements (land for monitoring unit, easement for culvert and access rights etc.) the following has now been agreed:

- The car park will be completely resurfaced on completion of the project.
- The existing 4 street lights will be replaced with modern street lights.
- A new footpath and pedestrian gateway to the Youth Resource Centre will be provided.
- The existing football changing room at the side of the Community Hall will be removed.
- Subject to planning permission being granted, a new football changing room will be provided and erected on the Roman Park. This will be a sturdy portacabin type building, a considerable improvement on the existing facility (three times the size and all utilities provided) which we consider will be of great benefit to the local community. The Parish Council intend to further develop the building once on site for use by the Parish, the possibility of obtaining grants for this purpose will be explored.

From the design drawings we have received, the appearance of the area opposite the Community Hall and Social Club will be much improved when the work is complete. The project is planned to commence in Mar 2011.

## **Roman Park**

Despite the signs at the main gate (and constant reminders in the CCN and parish website), there are still people parking in front of the main gate and exercising dogs in the park. (Disturbingly, the parish litter picker has informed me that he often finds dog poo in the park) The Community site car park should be used if you intend to enter the park. On the question of dogs, Herefordshire Council will be introducing new Dog Control orders soon, the Roman Park will be designated as a "dog free zone", and people taking dogs in the park are liable to be fined.

## **Survey of Sewers in Credenhill**

A questionnaire is included in this edition of the CCN in an effort to identify problems relating to the sewer system in Credenhill. The Parish Council are working with Herefordshire Council in an attempt to get all the main sewers adopted by a water company. I would be grateful if you could find time to complete the questionnaire so that we are able to analyse the problems in Credenhill.

## **Bus Stop on the A480 (Top of the village)**

I am pleased to report that the seat at the bus stop has now been repaired. Herefordshire Council are currently undertaking a feasibility study to provide a new bus shelter and are also looking at the possibility of providing a small lay-by at the site for road safety purposes.

## **Foot/cycle path to Stretton Sugwas**

Plans are proceeding satisfactorily; Councillor Bob Matthews is pursuing this on behalf of the Parish Council.

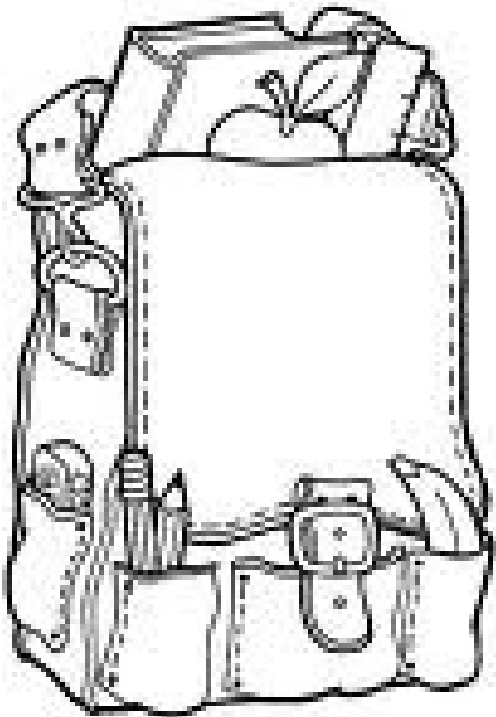

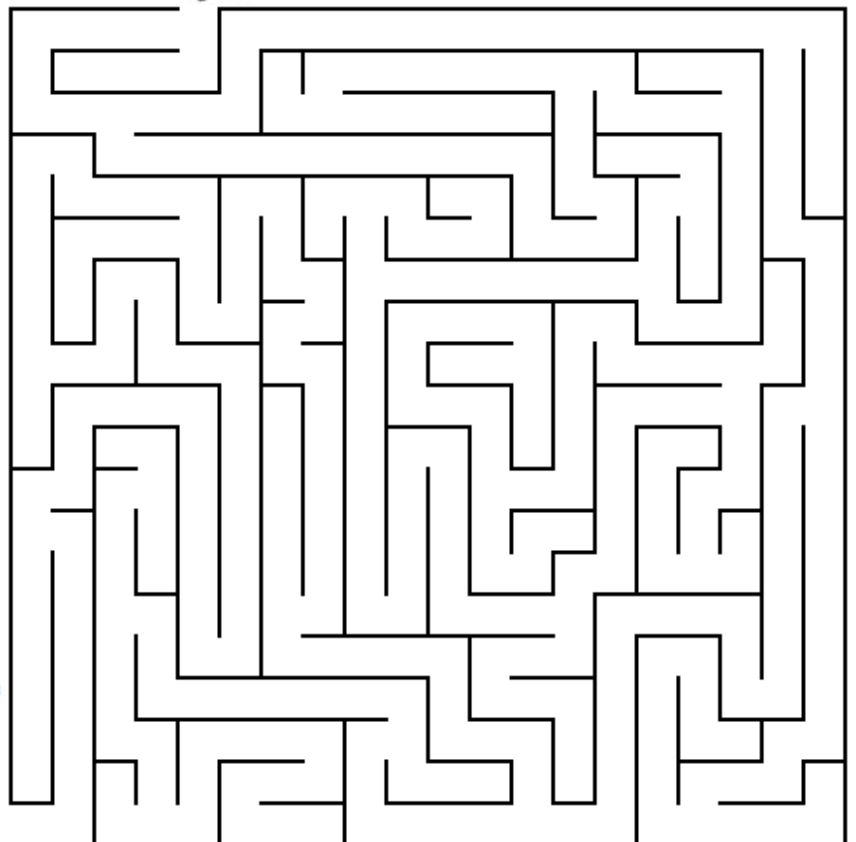
