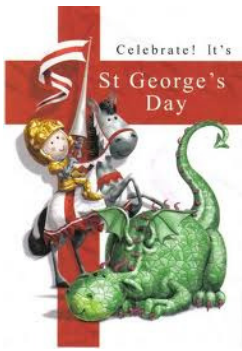

Dear Friends,

I have just finished the latest book in my favourite series, 'The Number One Ladies Detective Agency'. As crime novels go these are incredibly sedate stories but a good antidote for the frenetic activity of daily life!

Crime novels and dramas on television about the police are very popular in our culture. Politicians sometimes talk about whether this reflects or creates public anxiety about crime but whatever the answer, we are fortunate to live in an area in which the crime rate is relatively low.

Violent crime devastates lives - both the victims and the perpetrators - and is even worse when it is undertaken in the name of God. Think of the dreadful things done recently in the name of Christianity and Islam in different parts of the world. Violence and religion often go hand in hand but that is not the way it is meant to be. At the end of the month we will be celebrating the festival of Easter and telling again the story of the arrest, trial and crucifixion of Jesus. He was the God man who was able to take into himself the very worst that evil could throw at him and defeat the power of it without retaliating with violence. Proving, as Archbishop Desmond Tutu of South Africa wrote that, 'Goodness is stronger than evil, love is stronger than hate, light is stronger than darkness and truth is stronger than lies.'

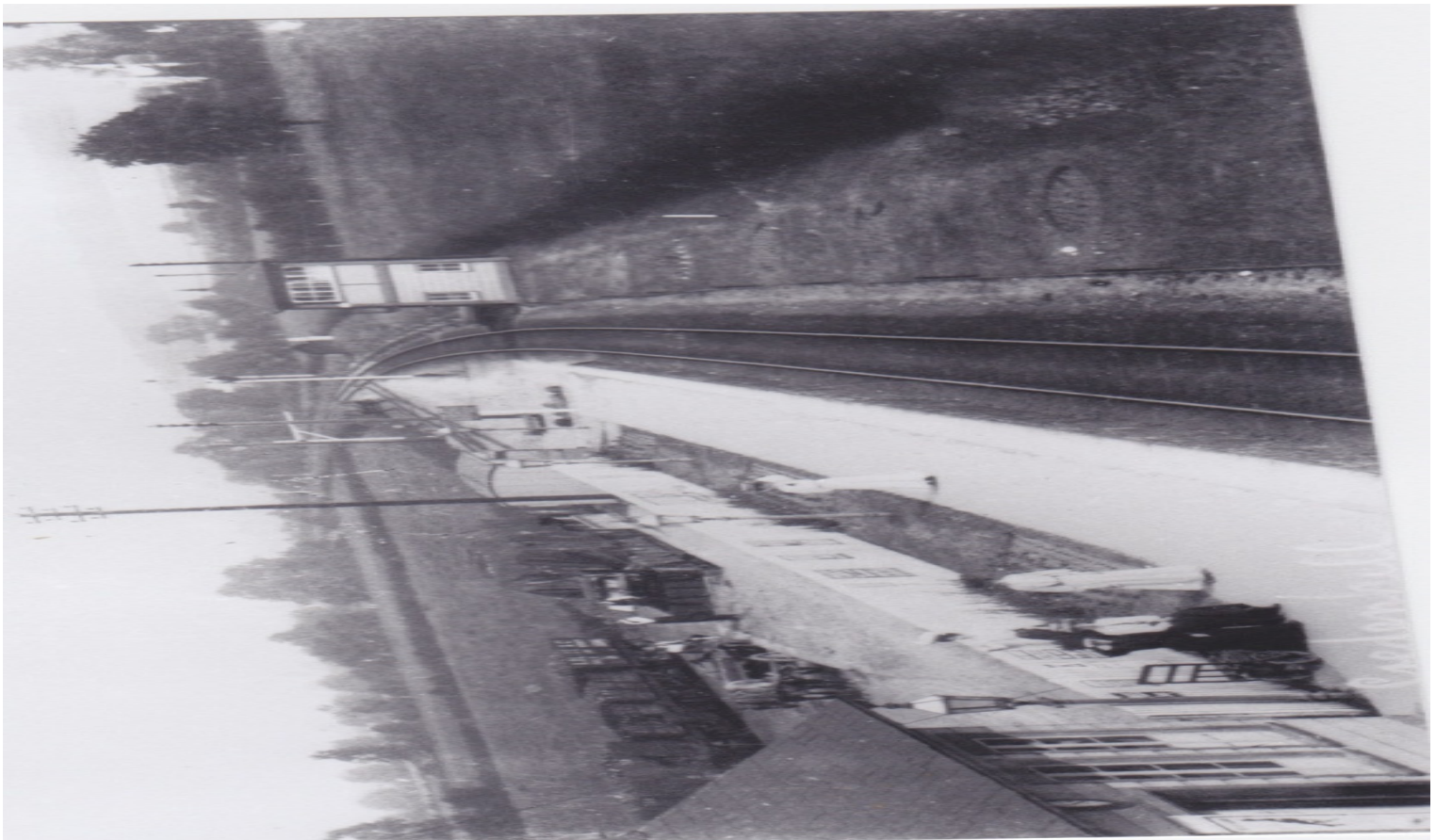

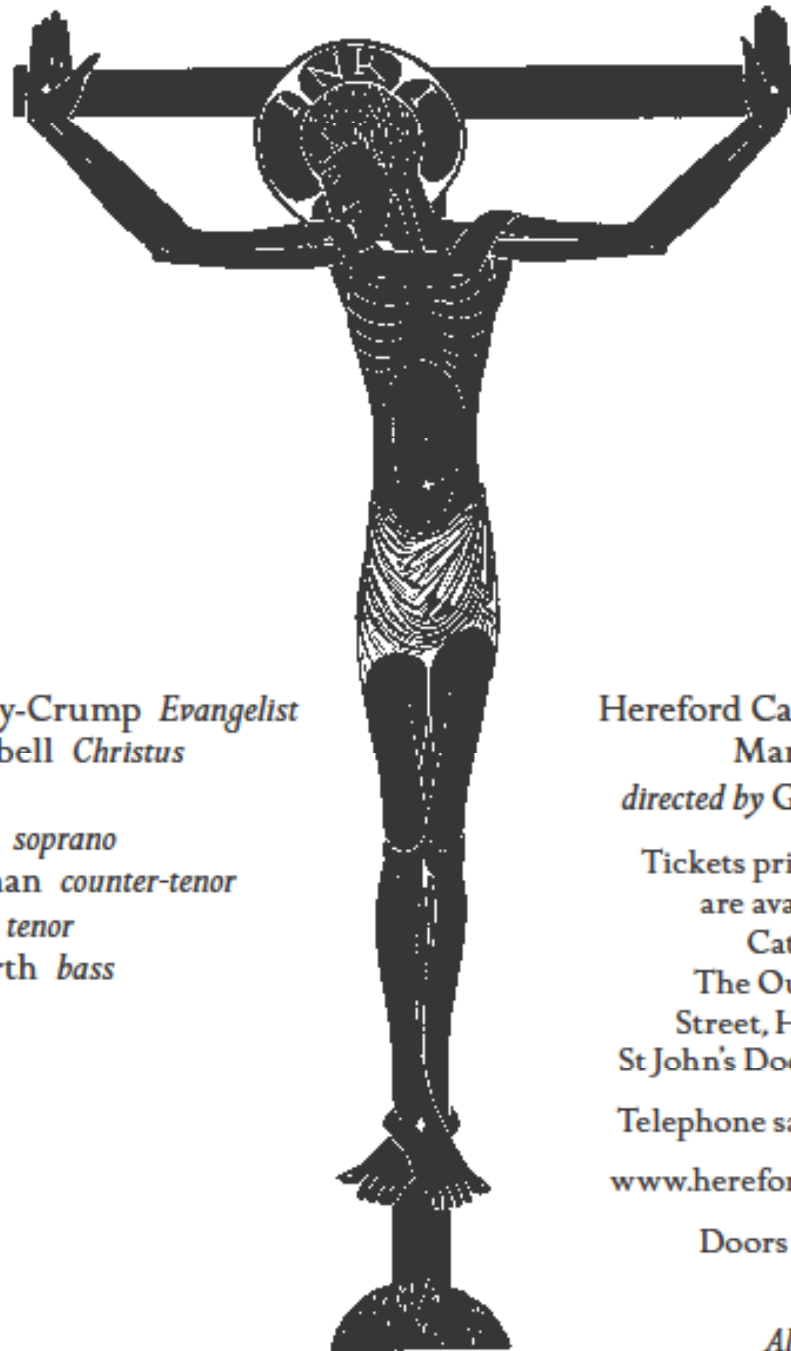
