Parish Meetings

The Freedom of Information Act 2000 gives a general right of access to all types of recorded information held by public authorities. Whilst most of the information relating to parish business is available on the parish website I am aware that this is not available to all parishioners. If anybody would like to see any parish records (minute's agendas, account statements etc.) please contact me. Paper copies of each document will be provided if requested; in this case a charge of 10p per A4 sheet of paper will be made to cover production and postage costs.

Dear Friends,

One of the great joys of being a priest is to be able to take Christening Services for families. It is wonderful to rejoice with the proud parents on the safe arrival of their precious baby or to take the service for older children who are more aware of what is going on. A theme that runs through the service is the awareness of the huge responsibility and challenge of parenthood and the importance of the support of the family and community which surrounds the parents.

For most of us the early years of our children's lives are fairly easy to manage (once we have adapted to the changes of life which having a child brings!) but for some it is the transfer from childhood to adolescence and then adolescence to adulthood which causes the most friction.

Our children still need us but want their independence – kicking against the boundaries but still needing that security until they are ready to fly the nest. It is at this time that the extended family and friends can be most helpful to both parent and child in defusing some of the tensions! It is also a time when parents can feel alienated as our offspring's peer group seems to have the most influence on their lives. We must not underestimate however the influence we do have and the years of love, respect and trust we have built with our children which is vital in their transition.

Many of us were shocked, angered and saddened by the rioting and looting in some of our cities last month - young people as young as 10 years old out on the streets grabbing all that they could from smashed shop windows. It is easy to condemn the children and their parents but perhaps one of the underlying issues in the troubles is the question of where we find our value – in what we own or in who we are? We all need to be valued and loved unconditionally or we do not thrive properly whatever age we are. In bringing children for baptism I believe that families are responding to the amazing experience of having their children and through that coming into direct contact with the unconditional love of God.

As a church we are hoping to find new ways of supporting families and children and hopefully under the guidance of our new vicar encouraging them to take the next steps in their journey of faith.

Meanwhile I pray that we all, whatever our age, know how precious we are to God and how much he rejoices in each one of us - for who we are not what we do or own.

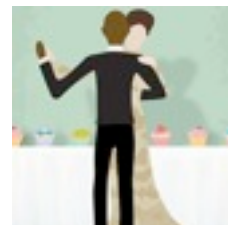

Celeriac and chorizo soup

A gorgeous, warming soup for an autumn night, made from delicious celery-like celeriac with chorizo sausage, onions and fresh parsley.

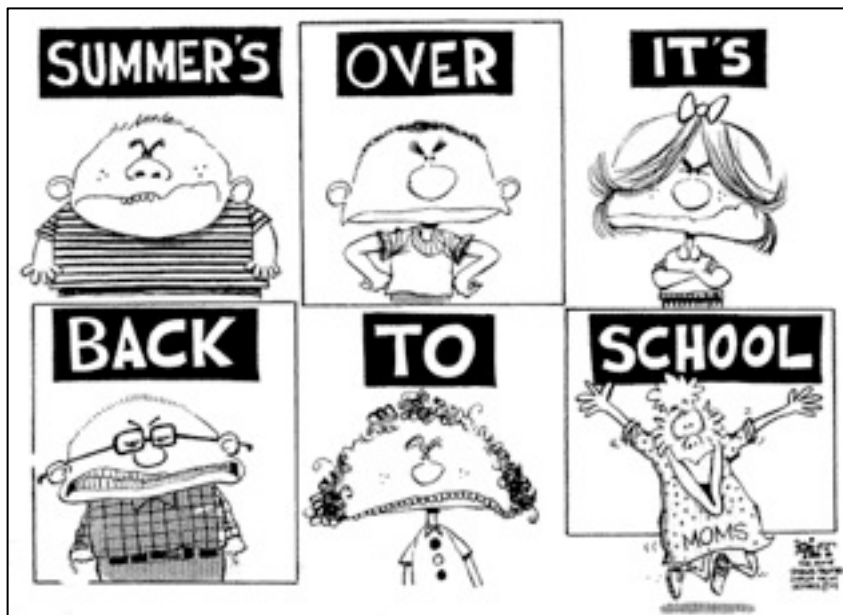


Ingredients

- 25g (1oz) butter
- 1 onion, peeled and diced
- 1 potato, peeled and cubed (about 200g/7oz)
- 1 celeriac (about 750g/1½ lb) peeled and cubed
- 600ml (1 pint) hot good chicken or vegetable stock
- Salt and freshly ground black pepper
- 600ml (1 pint) milk
- 300g (10oz) Spanish chorizo sausage, skin peeled off
- Flat leaved parsley, whole leaves or roughly chopped

Method

Put the butter and onion in a large pan and cook over a medium heat, covered, for 5 mins, stirring occasionally until softened but not browned. Add the cubes of potato and celeriac, stir well and cook, covered over low heat for 10 mins, stirring occasionally. Pour in the stock, half cover and cook for 30-35 mins or until the vegetables are tender enough to mash. Puree the mixture in a food processor until smooth. Pour it back into the pan, add the milk, season well and warm through. Add more milk or stock to get the soup the consistency you like. Slice the chorizo and put into a frying pan over a medium heat for a few minutes, turning the slices over until just browned on both sides and the flavoured oil is released. Spoon the soup into bowls. Place chorizo slices on top and drizzle the oil over. Add parsley leaves and sprinkle with freshly ground black pepper.
