A new "Vicar" in a new Vicarage - and exciting time for us all

They were quite demanding, the two days of informal meetings, parish tours, and formal interviews. But the great thing was that, at the end of the process, everyone was clear about what God wanted them to do. Thirteen people sat together in the Bishop's Palace, and the Bishop asked each one in turn - "Is this the right person for the job?" - and each had been instructed to answer with one word - yes, no, or maybe. All thirteen said "Yes"! To complete the full set, when the Bishop then rang the candidate and offered them the job, she also said "Yes". We had all been praying for guidance from God, and for wisdom and discernment, and we took our unanimity as a sign that our prayers had been answered.

So on the 18th of November,(details next month!), the Revd Rana Davies-James will be installed as the new Priest-in-Charge, and by then Rana and her husband Trevor will be installed in the "new" Vicarage, which is just behind the school in Credenhill.

There has continued to be a lot of good, prayerful work going on in the twelve months since Revd Cliff Knight retired, and the two "teams" have done a fantastic job. Revd Angie Deane, Revd Snowy Davoll and Mr Mike Wilkinson have led the "ministry team", whilst the churchwardens have held the "management team" role, and we all owe them a deep debt of gratitude for all they have done. And I know that all of them feel excited by this new opportunity for the churches and the communities (as do I!). Having someone to lead the work, to help focus the energy, and to add their own gifts and prayers can only make things richer and stronger.

So please get ready to give Rana and Trevor a very warm welcome - and to give them your support and friendship as this new phase for the Christian community, and all the people you serve, gets under way very soon.

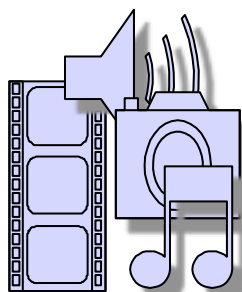

Faster broadband - make your voice heard

A major survey has been launched in our parishes and market towns to help bring high-speed broadband to rural Herefordshire.

With the support of Government funding to improve broadband in rural communities, work is expected to begin in south Herefordshire next year, and will then be extended throughout the county.

Local Broadband Champion volunteers are being recruited to help engage their local communities. In the coming weeks questionnaires will go out to thousands of homes and businesses to gather evidence on demand for superfast broadband. Or you can do the survey online at www.fastbroadband4herefordshire.org.uk.

Cllr Graham Powell, broadband champion for project partner Herefordshire Council, said: "These questionnaires are crucial to the process of bringing superfast broadband to Herefordshire. We urge every household and business to complete and return them."
