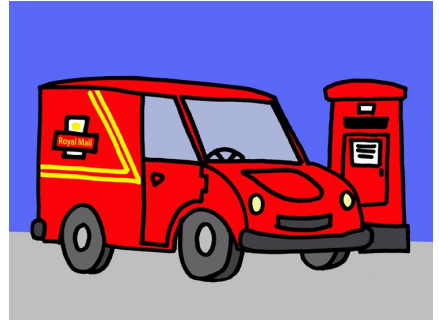

POST OFFICE VAN / MOBILE OFFICE

It's the third anniversary of the mobile Post Office service in the village, a facility that is convenient and much appreciated by some of our residents and small businesses.

The mobile office, operated by a Post Office van with a high-speed internet connection, can do any-

thing a main post office can do, including car/vehicle tax, passports, parcels, overseas mail, utility payments as well as the usual stamps and mailings. It is a case of 'use it or lose it', and if more residents use the van it will secure its continuation as a service to the village. The van parks in the neck of Trenchard Avenue, just off Station Road, Mondays, Tuesdays and Thursdays from 10.30 until 11.45am. Please do use it.

There will therefore be an election for the Ward Councillor position on 2nd May – the Polling Station will be the community hall.

Next Meeting

The press and members of the public are invited to the Annual General Meeting of the Parish Council that will be held at the Resource Centre on 15th May 2019 from 19:00. This will be immediately followed by an Ordinary Parish Council Meeting. The agenda for both meetings will be published on the website and notice board on or before 10th May 2019.

Defibrillator Update

With thanks to Onestop the Defibrillator has now been installed and is operational. The code to the cabinet is **C159X**; please keep it in your phone or purse/wallet so that should you need to help somebody in a critical condition then you can. The ambulance service has been briefed.

So far we have run 3 Heartstart training sessions in conjunction with Herefordshire Heartstart meaning that an additional 40+ local people have live saving skills to help in the event of an emergency; critically most of Onestop staff have completed the training meaning we have a central hub of lifesavers that are ready and willing to help!



It is crucial to remember that whether you have received training or not the defibrillator is very easy to use (press a button and then it talks to you and tells you what to do). It will not shock a person unless its internal system tells it that the person needs to be shocked. Remember; you cannot make the situation worse by trying to help; if nothing else just get more help!

We will continue to run training sessions whilst the need is there; we currently plan to publish 3 further dates soon.

The Great Herefordshire Spring Clean

Considering the size of Credenhill it was disappointing that only 9 people turned out to help. However; what a great improvement to our local area helping the wildlife in the process. Approx. 12 bags of trash and car parts along with 1 bag of cans and a coconut removed from or verges. Road Closures 12th of May

On Sunday 12th May, St Michael's Hospice will be holding RUN Hereford, an annual event comprising a Marathon, Half Marathon, 10K and 5K.

Each year, 1,200 runners and their supporters help make this one of our biggest fundraisers, contributing around £60,000 towards the Hospice's care costs.

Due to ongoing roadworks on Grandstand Road, close to our usual venue at Hereford Leisure Centre, the start and finish has moved to the Livestock Market on Roman Road (A4103).

To make this day as safe and enjoyable for everyone taking part, we have arranged road closures throughout the morning and early afternoon along the following routes:

- Stretton Sugwas roundabout (A480 and A4103) to the Roman Road junction with Tillington Road (opposite Ned Potter Ltd) from 8.30am to 2.00pm.
- Tillington Road between the Roman Road (A4103) and the crossroads near Burghill Valley golf course between 10am and 11am.
- Crowmoor Lane (near Burghill Valley Golf Club) - all directions 8.30am to 2.00pm. A map is included. Diversions will be in place, with marshals on hand to answer any queries and allow access to and from homes and businesses when deemed safe to do so.

Please be aware that the 5K event, featuring 300 runners of all ages, will take place on the Roman Road between the Stretton Sugwas roundabout and the Tillington turning. This means there will be a strict road closure in place with no access between 10.00am and 11.20am.

Every year, runners tell us how much they appreciate the support from spectators along the route, and we know they would appreciate your backing again this year. We are sorry for any inconvenience this may cause, and thank you for your support and understanding. If you have any queries, please contact me using the details below.

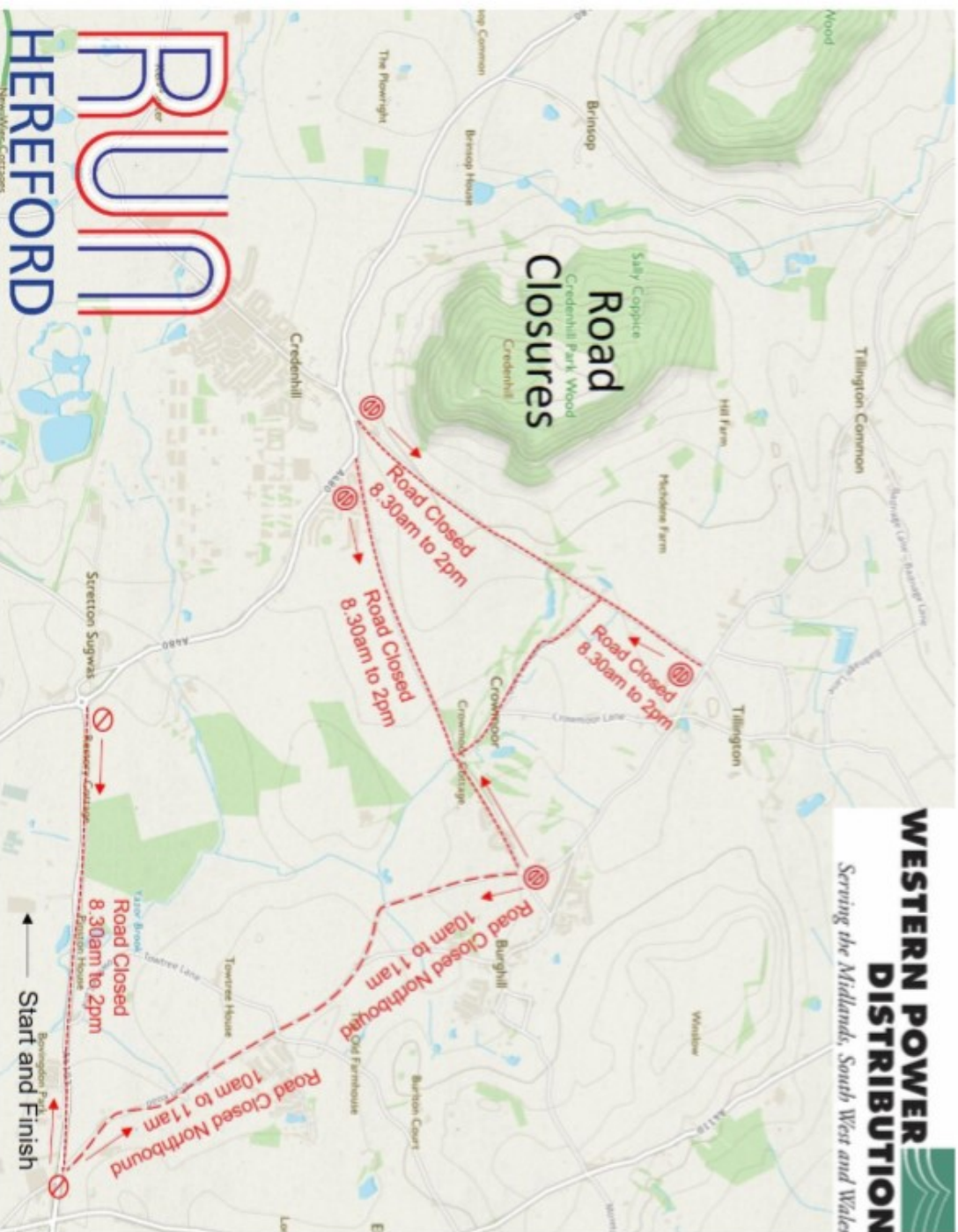

Dear Friends,

Loneliness is one of the hardest things for a human being for we were made to be in a relationship with God, and with others; however that looks, as friends, colleagues, family or partners. Whilst on his travels, Saint Paul wrote of the support he felt from those who travelled with him and those who supported him from afar. He couldn't have made his extraordinary journey without the support of friends, and neither can we. 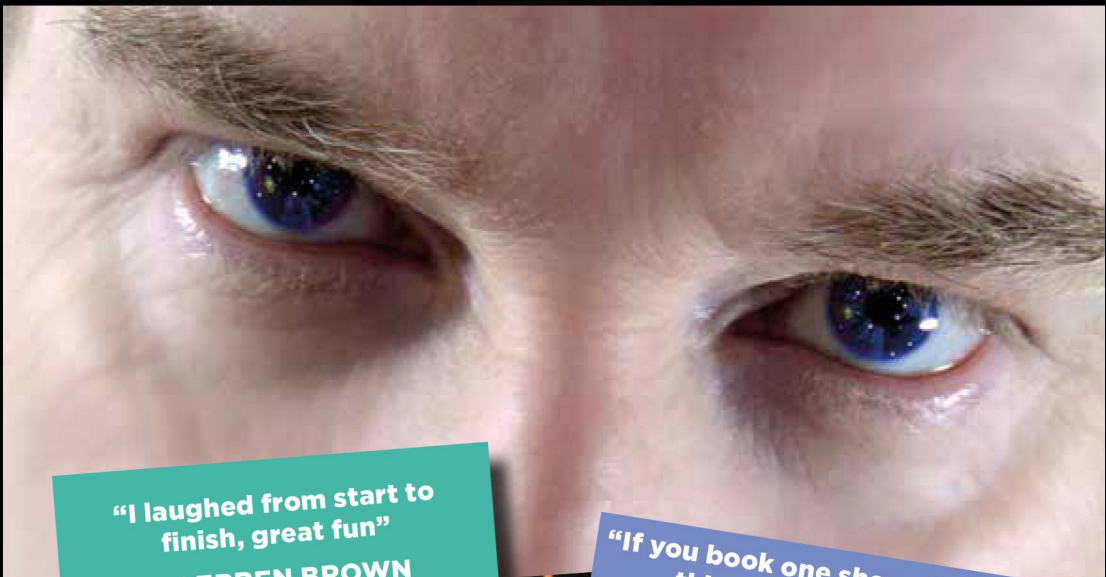
