The 2018/19 financial year saw changes to the clerk costs with an increase in worked hours from 10 to 15 hours per week. We also had a 30% increase in Handyman/Maintenance costs and absorbed a number of significant unplanned costs such as Repairs to the climbing frame and Tree Removal costs on Roman Park as well as investing in improvements to the resource centre.

The outlook for 2019/20 is challenging with our assets requiring significant investment however a robust budget and recent savings on tenders should help us to continue to build on the last 12 months of continued improvement.

Churchwardens' Report

Thank you to everyone who has responded to Jean Bowles' appeal for the redecoration of the church. The fund now stands at £3,000. If anyone would like to contribute please contact Jean Bowles or Rev Rana.

We have had a quote for the decoration of the walls of the church of £3,500.

The Parish Council have agreed to fund the replacement of the gates at the entrance to the churchyard and the PCC have agreed to replace the ironmongery whilst this work is being done.

The next All-age service will be at Pentecost, (Whitsuntide) on Sunday 9th June at 11 am. This is a short service, about 40 mins, and is a good opportunity for those of you who would like to join in but are worried by the more formal service of communion. Everyone is very welcome and we will end the service with coffee and cake. If anyone needs a lift please ring me on 761935 and we will organise it.

After this service any items that have been left for the Hereford Food Bank will be taken to them. They are particularly short of tinned rice pudding, custard, jam, chutney, tomato sauce, sardines and other tinned fish, tinned meat, toiletries especially toothbrushes, If you would like to give anything please leave it at the back of the church.

This will be held on Saturday 15th June from 9-11. There will be bacon rolls, croissants etc as well as a stall and raffle.

The Vicar's Letter

Dear Friends,

I've just been doing some de-cluttering ready for spring-cleaning. We hang onto a lot of stuff, don't we? But we also hang on to things that you can't drop into the bin or take to a charity shop. Some of those are from really happy memories, special relationships and precious times, and these are all good things to hold on to. Not everything we hang onto though is good. Some of it is burdensome; it drags us down and holds us back. What are some of those things? They include Regrets - and we all have them. Things we did, things we didn't do; and Disappointments - those unfulfilled dreams and aspirations. Sometimes we do our best and it simply isn't enough, but at least we tried and God never wastes anything. But we mustn't allow our failures and difficulties to stick to us and follow us around. Isaiah tells us to '*Shake off your dust; rise up, sit enthroned ... free yourself from the chains on your neck which make you a captive*' (Isaiah 2:52). Unforgiveness is another burden, one which devastates us - but *not* the person we are refusing to forgive. Eventually, if we are not to become harmed by it, we will have to shake that off too by making the decision to forgive, as it's hard to move on when we're weighed down. So, if we carry a rucksack of regrets, disappointments and unforgiveness, God calls us to release them all to him. Jesus died to take it all: all our regrets, failures and disappointments, as well as our sin. In order to move forward we have to travel light, so let's unload our rucksacks, hand over the contents to God our Father, and move on in freedom. I'm good at identifying and throwing things out that are no longer any use; if you need my help with this, let me know.
